

Check Proximity to Campus and Public Transport


Being close to your university or a major transport hub can save time and money. Bonus points for nearby grocery stores and cafes!

REVISED HOUSING GLOSSARY:

Key Terms You Need to Know

Accommodation Types

Dormitory

Shared living space, often on-campus, with communal areas like bathrooms and lounges.

Studio Apartment

Self-contained unit combining a bedroom, living area, and kitchen into a single room.

Shared Flat

Private bedroom with shared living space and amenities, such as the kitchen and bathroom, with other students.

Guesthouse

A privately owned, home-like residence for short-term stays, offering a personal atmosphere.



Contract Terms

Lease Agreement

The contract between tenant and landlord, outlining rent, rules, responsibilities, and rental period.

Security Deposit

Money paid upfront to cover potential damages or unpaid rent, refundable at the end if no issues arise.

Utilities Included

Rent includes basic services like electricity, water, gas, and internet.

Bills Included

Rent also covers additional services like internet, heating, or cleaning.

Subletting

When a tenant rents out their accommodation, or part of it, to another person, often needing the landlord's approval.



Amenities and Features

Furnished Apartment

Comes with essential furniture like a bed, desk, and wardrobe.

Wi-Fi Wireless internet access provided with the accommodation.

En-suite A private bathroom attached directly to your bedroom for personal use.

Shared Facilities

Common areas and amenities like kitchens, bathrooms, and laundry used by all tenants.

On-site Laundry

Laundry facilities available within the building, including washing machines and dryers.





Wheelchair Accessible

Accommodations designed for students with mobility needs, featuring ramps, wide doorways, and accessible bathrooms.

Universal Design

Design principles that ensure environments are accessible to all, regardless of age or disability.



Financial Terms

Rent

Regular payment made to the landlord for living in the accommodation, typically paid monthly.

Deposit

A similar term for the security deposit, which covers potential damages or unpaid rent, often refundable.



Legal and Rights

Tenancy Agreement

Another term for the lease, which defines the terms, conditions, and rights during the rental period.

Notice Period

The amount of time a tenant or landlord must give to end the tenancy, as stated in the lease.

Non-Discrimination Clause

Legal protection that prevents discrimination based on race, gender, disability, or other characteristics.



Living Arrangements

Single Occupancy

A room or apartment for one person.

Double Occupancy

A shared room or apartment for two people

Flatmate/Housemate

Someone who shares a flat or house with you, including common areas but having their own private bedroom.



TOP 3 PITFALLS TO AVOID WHEN FINDING HOUSING

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Falling for Scams

Watch out for unrealistic offers! If the price seems too good to be true, it probably is. Always use verified platforms and never send money before seeing the accommodation or receiving a signed contract.



Skipping the Fine Print

Read the contract carefully. Don't overlook details like deposit terms, utilities included, or notice periods for termination. Know exactly what you're committing to avoid surprises later.



Delaying the Search

Start looking early! The best housing options fill up quickly. Begin your search as soon as you're accepted into your program to secure a safe and affordable place.



CHECKLIST FOR SECURING ACCOMMODATION

Start early

Begin your search as soon as you know your study destination.

Set a budget

Calculate rent, utilities, and living expenses. Stick to a realistic budget.

Use verified platform

Look for housing on trusted websites, your university's housing service, or platforms with verified listings like the Erasmus+ App.

Check for Quality Labels

Look for accommodations using the HOME Quality Labels to ensure safety, comfort, and inclusivity.

Ask about utilities & amenities

Confirm what's included (e.g., Wi-Fi, heating, laundry) to avoid unexpected costs.



Double-check all terms: rent, deposits, maintenance responsibilities, and notice periods.



Inspect onsite or request a virtual tour

If possible, visit the place or request a virtual tour to see the actual condition.



Secure a rental agreement

Ensure you have a signed contract before making any payments.

Plan your arrival


Arrange for temporary accommodation if needed and know how to get to your new home from the airport or station.
